Submissions Guidelines

For audio works please use the .wav or .aif formats with 16bit 44.1kHz files. For audio/video works please use the .mov format, H.264 video compression, and uncompressed 16bit 44.1kHz audio. Please use a web-based file-transfer service such as Dropbox or YouSendIt to submit your files to <u>sayit@moldover.com</u>. Please mention in your email which category you are entering.

Contest entries must be submitted on or before June 9th, 2013.

Tips

This Ableton session was created with Live 8.4.1. The source videos in this pack are 720x480. Render at that resolution with a good codec like H.264 for best results.

Ableton's video features were designed for people working in post-production to create sound for video. Video editing in Ableton is limited to chopping and warping. Only one video (whichever is the lowest video in the arrangement view) can be played at a time. Please read more on Ableton's video features in the manual.

Working with video in Ableton sucks up lots of memory. If the video window is locking up, or the program is crashing, try quitting and restarting every once in a while to clear the memory cache.

Ableton has a hard time rendering complex video edits. If Ableton is crashing in the process of rendering video, try rendering your video in small pieces. Export 16 bars at a time (or 30 seconds at a time), and then quit and restart to render the next 16 bars. You can assemble all these smaller pieces in a new empty session, and then render them all as one long video.

Ableton has a hard time rendering micro-edits and extreme warping of video files. If your rendered video files seems to "freeze up" at a certain point, try going to that point in your arrangement, and simplifying the edits and warping. You may have to use a different editing technique, or make short renders of complex edits to achieve the desired effect. Ableton often adds a bit of extra silence and blank frames to rendered video files. There is nothing you can do about this. Just be sure that any rendered video file you re-import into a session has its end carefully trimmed to remove that silence.
